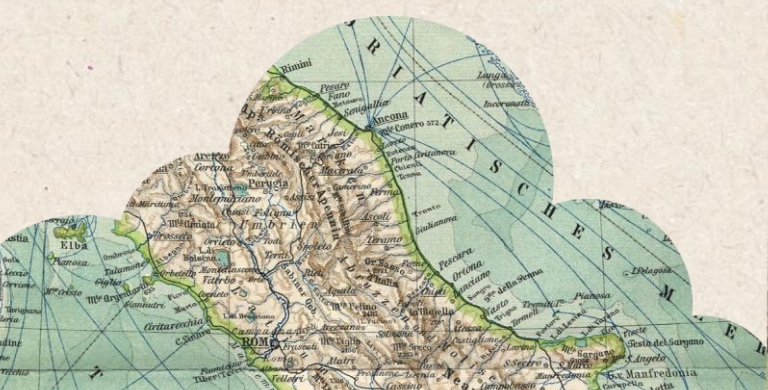

ENGLISH WORD	EXPLANATION	TRANSLATION
COUNTY	an area of a state or country that has its own government to deal with local <u>matters</u>	grofija, okrožje
BARROW	a large pile of earth like a small hill that was put over a grave in ancient times	gomila
HILL FORT	a type of earthwork used as a fortified refuge or defended settlement	utrdba na hribu
SHRINE	a place that is <u>connected</u> with a <u>holy event</u> or holy person, and that people <u>visit</u> to <u>pray</u>	svetišče
PREHISTORY	the time in history before anything was written down	prazgodovina
INFIRM	<u>a person that is weak</u> or <u>ill</u> for a long time	bolnik
DERELICT	a <u>derelict</u> building or piece of land is in very bad <u>condition</u> because it has not been used for a long time	zapuščen
URBAN SPRAWL	the spread of city buildings and houses into an area that used to be countryside	razraščanje mesta
MANUFACTURE	to use <u>machines</u> to make goods or <u>materials</u> , usually in large numbers or amounts	proizvodnja

## Roman baths and town

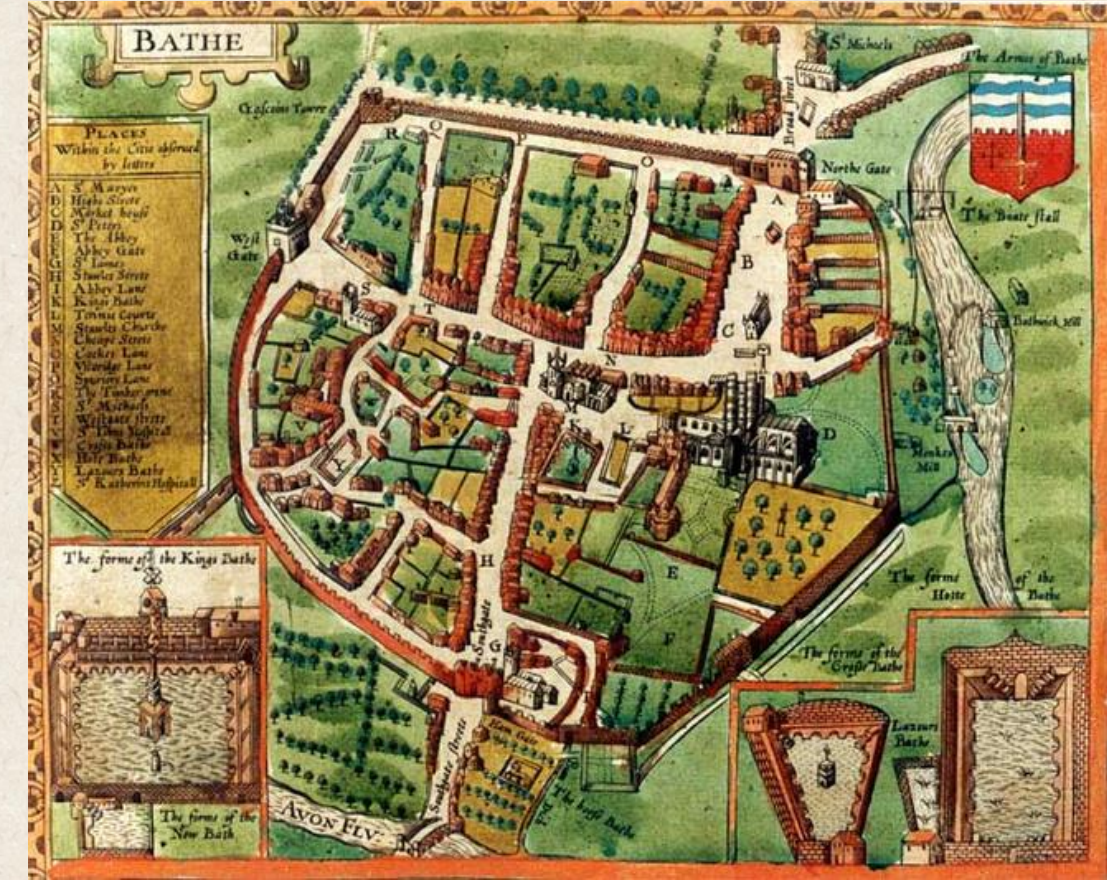
- a shrine to goddess Sulis

- Acemannesceastre (aching men's city),

- Edgar of England, 973 Bath Abbey
- Hospital of the baths



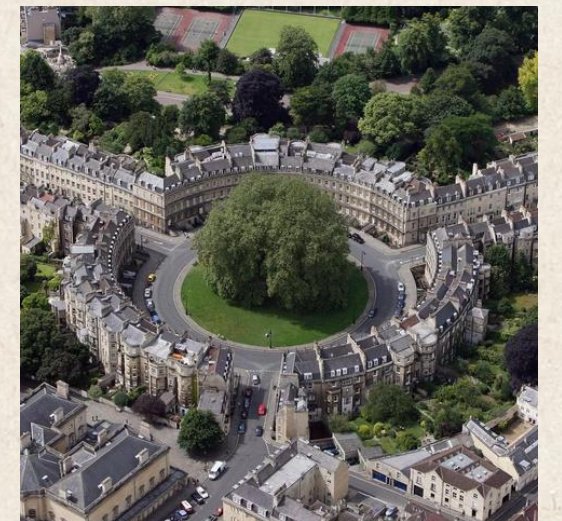


# Early modern and Late modern

- 2021-> the great Spas of Europe



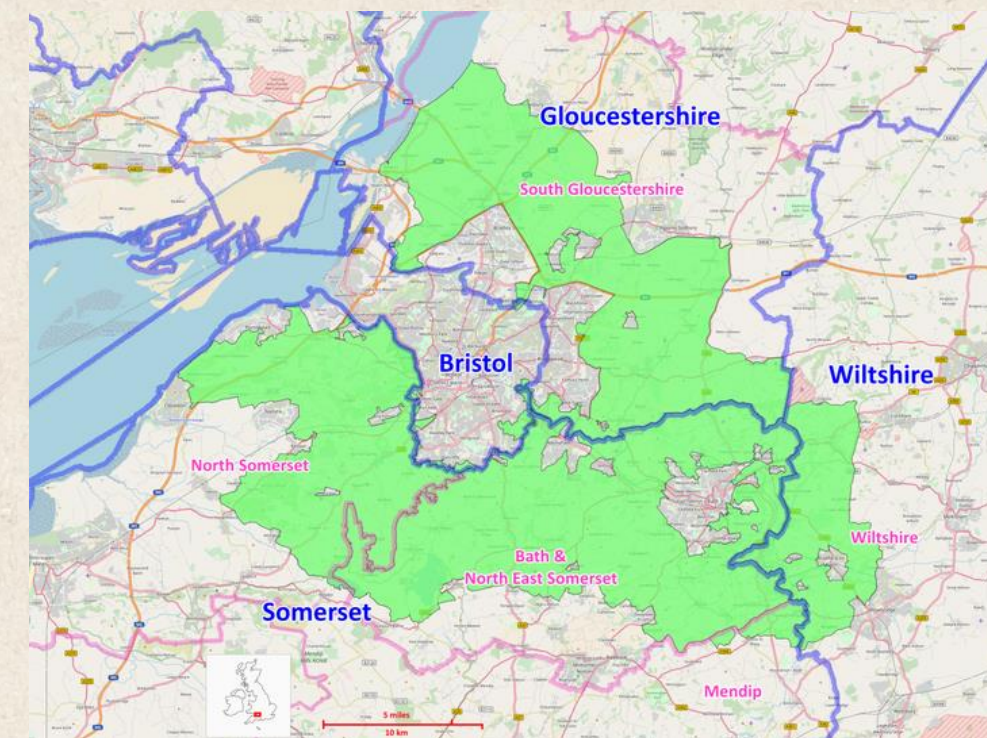
- More buildings in Georgian time

# Geography and environment



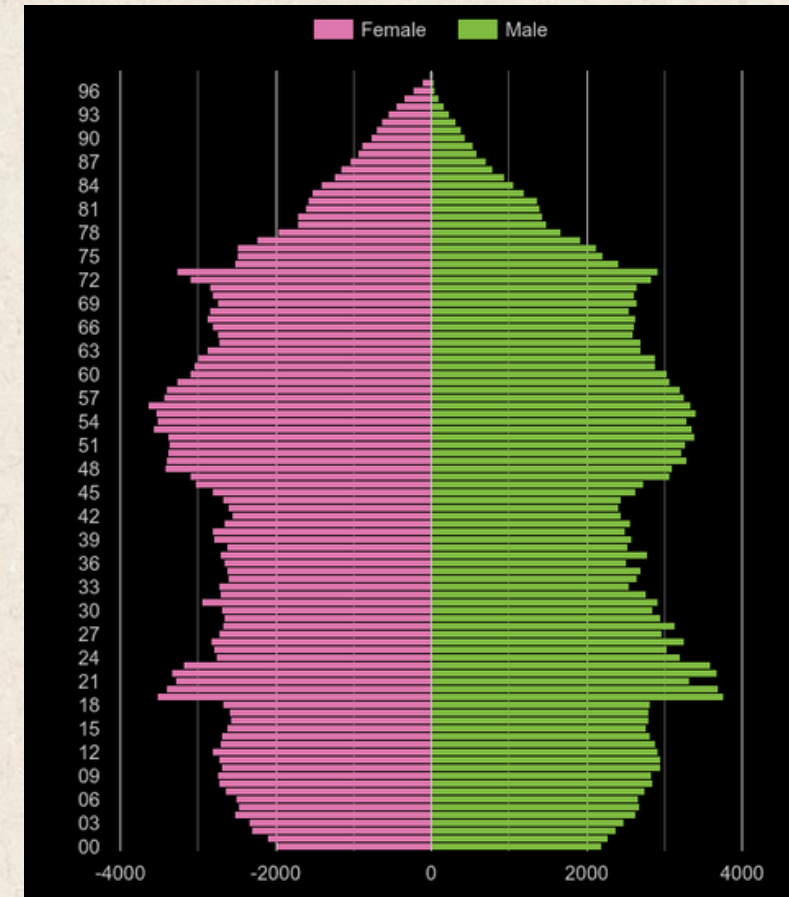
- In the Avon Valley, Limestone hills,

# Demography

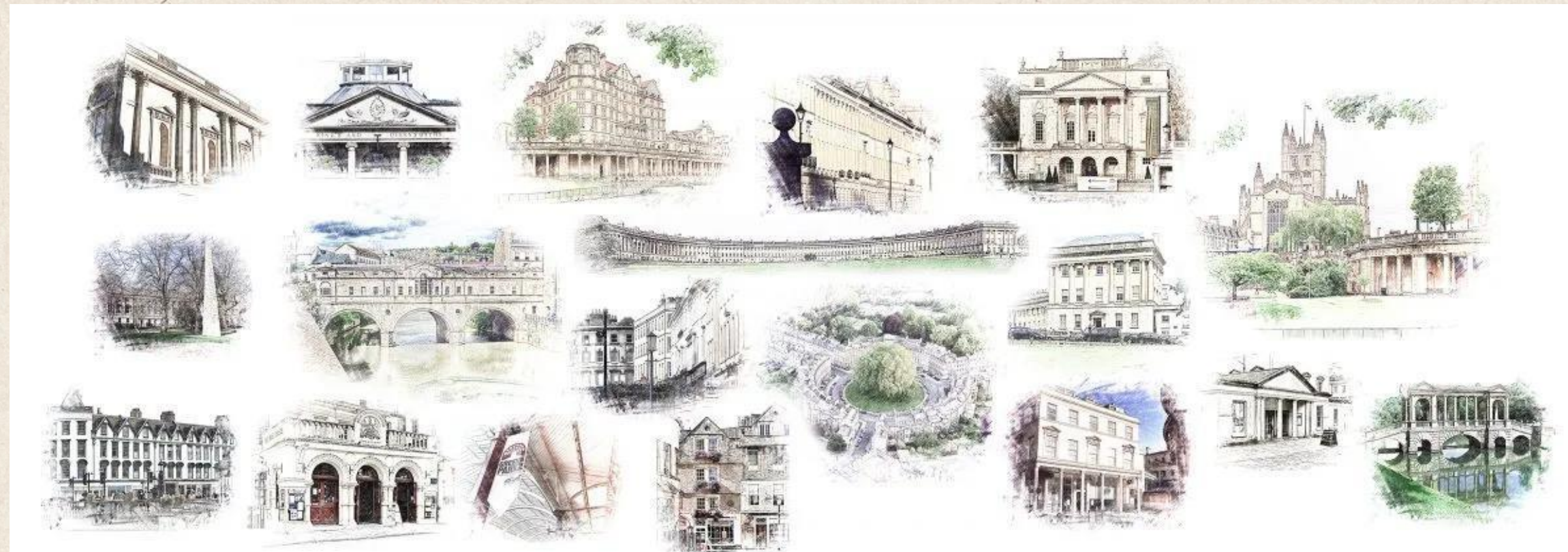
- 90.000 inhabitants

# Economy

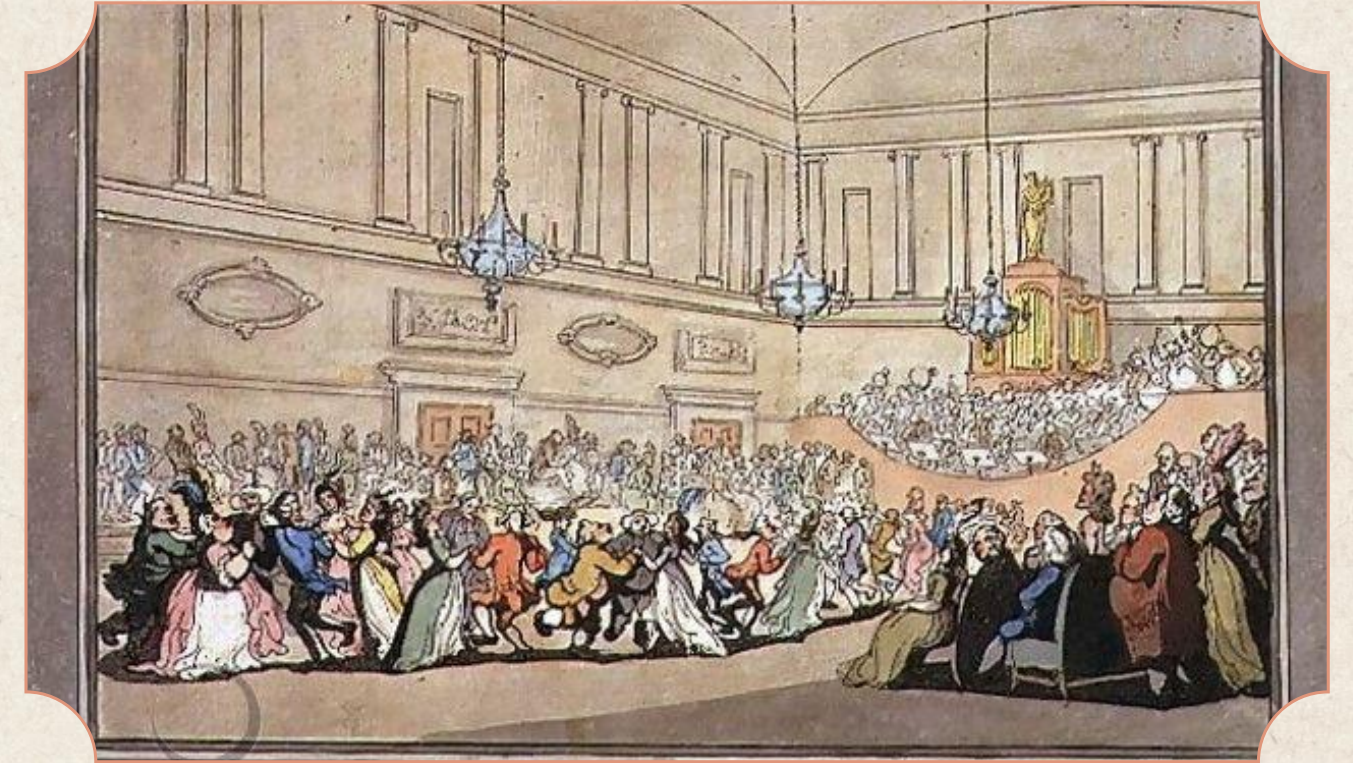
- PAST-> manufacturing sector
